

Why You Need a Home Escape Plan

- When fire strikes there is no time to think.
- Most fatal fires happen at night when people are sleeping.
- Fire is fast, hot and dark!
- The faster everyone can exit the home, the sooner the fire department can be notified and respond.

Creating a Plan

- Install working smoke alarms.
- Create a home escape plan with the entire family.
- Post it for all family members to see.
- Show TWO ways out of each room.
- Identify a family meeting place a safe distance away from the home.

Practising Your Plan

- Hold regular fire drills at least twice per year.
- Involve ALL family members!
- Make your practise realistic.
- Practise two ways out.



If There is a Fire...

- When the smoke alarm sounds leave immediately!
- Check doors before opening them.
- If your first exit is blocked, use your second exit.
- Crawl low under smoke.
- Gather at the family meeting place after exiting the home.
- ONCE OUT STAY OUT!

Notifying the Fire Department

- Ensure all family members know the emergency telephone number.
- Call 9-1-1 from a neighbours' phone.
- Stay on the line until the operator tells you to hang up.



If You are Trapped...

- Close all doors between you and the fire.
- Fill cracks around the door with blankets or cloths.
- Call 9-1-1.
- If safe, open the window and signal for help.
- DO NOT HIDE! Yell for help and listen for firefighters

Special Considerations

- Windows and locks should be easy to unlock and open.
- Ensure you have a safe way to reach the ground from upper storey windows.
- Develop a plan for infants and young children, and family members with special needs.

Conclusion

Why Have a Home Escape Plan?

- When fire strikes there is no time to think!
- What you do in the first three minutes is crucial.

Key Parts of the Plan

- Ensure your home has working smoke alarms.
- Show TWO ways out of each room.
- Identify a family meeting place.
- Know your local emergency telephone number.
- Practice fire drills with Family
