Preliminary – 404 respondents October 2016

Summary

- High participation nearly 500 respondents
- Strong support for change 67% favour more waste diversion, even if it costs more.
- Transfer stations are used by 61% of respondents, private pick up by 24%
- Transfer stations are most important to the properties north of #4, least between #44 and #4




- 32% of respondents recycle outside the municipality, 9% reported they do not recycle
- Most yard waste is composted on site
- 2/3rds of respondents favour curbside pick up
- The large majority felt pick should occur only in residential areas
- The north residents prefer transfer stations

Summary


- High acceptance for curb side pickup and reduction in transfer station location or hours of operation south of #4 highway
- Strong opposition to funding curbside pickup "at large"
- Good support for "special service levies"


Primary Transfer Stations/Landfill used by respondent




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Site satisfaction with transfer station/landfill

5 being the highest score and 1 being the lowest score




How is your waste currently disposed of? (check all that apply)






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
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Would you be interested in having a curbside garbage and recycling program where you would be able to place all your recyclable items in one container?




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
Would you be interested in having a curbside garbage and recycling program where you would be able to place all your recyclable items in one container?



Over 65% of respondents are very interested or somewhat interested in curbside recycling If a curbside pickup program were implemented, in your view, where should it be implemented?








If the RM switched to curbside collection do you think you would still need to go to a transfer station?


