Animal Camp

Come learn all about the animal kingdom, and the furry friends that we can find in our own back yard! Let's explore hibernation, molting and natural defenses that are used by all kinds of creatures!

East Selkirk Summer Day Camp Behaviour Policy

Thank you for signing up for our camp this summer! We are very excited to have you join us! Our goal is to provide a safe and positive camp experience for all of our campers and staff this summer.

Please read the rules we have listed below, and the action steps the camp staff will take if the rules are not followed or misbehavior occurs.

East Selkirk Summer Day Camp Rules:

- Respect other campers and camp staff

- Respect the property of others
- Respect the facility
- NO BULLYING
- Listen to instructions from the camp staff
- Always stay with the group
- Use appropriate language
- Have fun!

Action steps for dealing with misbehavior:

First Step: The camp staff will verbally discuss with the camper the behaviour, why it is happening, and how they can fix it. The reasons behind why they cannot act the way they were will be explained to the camper also. After the discussion, the camper can resume the activity with the rest of the group.

Second Step: The camp staff will put the camper in a time out from activity for up to 15 minutes. Depending on whether the camper is willing to have another conversation, the time out may be shorter or longer. The camper has to reassure the camp staff that they understand why their behaviour is inappropriate before they will return back to the activity.

Third Step: If the previous two steps have been carried out and the behaviour is still continuing, a phone call will be made to the parents, and a discussion between the camp staff, camper, and the parents will take place. The behaviour will need to be corrected at this point, and if the behaviour continues then a possibility of removal from the camp will have to be discussed and/or implemented.

Removal from East Selkirk Summer Day Camp: If the three steps above have not corrected the camper's behaviour, the parents will be asked to remove the camper from the program. There will be no refund for the camp if this stage is reached. If the camper carries out an action that puts himself/herself, camp staff, or other campers in danger, camp staff reserves the right to bypass the three steps above and make a decision whether immediate action will be taken for the camper to be removed from the program, either for the day, week, or remainder of the summer.

If your child requires one-on-one care, please contact Taylor at recprograms@rmofstclements.com to discuss who will be attending with your child and fill out their information on the registration form. Our staff will have the whole group to be with, so any behavioural concerns should be made aware to camp staff prior to attending camp.

East Selkirk Summer Day Camp Health and Safety

Thank you for registering for another great year of East Selkirk Summer Day Camp!

The RM of St. Clements and its staff will be following best practices for the health and safety of all campers. Hand sanitizer will be available on site for everyone. Masks are not required, but campers are welcome to wear one. Camp will not have extra masks on hand.

If your child(ren) is ill, we ask that you do not bring them to camp that day. This way we can ensure that all campers are able to get the most out of camp! If campers begin to feel ill at camp, the parent/guardian will be contacted to pick up the camper from camp. The other parents/guardians who had campers at camp will be notified that there was a sick camper.
